Save the Rain Program Overview



Onondaga County Save the Rain Program

- 150 individual public and private GI projects completed-to -date
- Over 100 million gallons of stormwater captured
- Signature Projects
 - Civic Strip (OnCenter, War Memorial, Water Street, etc.)
 - HB Treatment Wetland
 - Rosamond Gifford Zoo (5 projects)
 - Connective Corridor
 - Vacant Lot Projects
 - Collaboration with City Parks





Green Improvement Fund (GIF)



GIF Program

The Green Improvement Fund (GIF) is a grant program developed by Onondaga County to incentivize the development of green infrastructure stormwater mitigation techniques on private property



Program Evolution

- GIF 1.0 (March 2010)
- GIF 2.0 (June 2011)
- GIF 3.0 (July 2012)
- GIF 4.0 (June 2013)
 - New program boundary based on updated SWMM
 - Funding tiers within program boundary
 - GIF award calculator available to public





Program Highlights


- 130 Applications Submitted to Date
- 59 Projects Completed
 - 23 Completed in 2013
- 42 projects awarded grant status currently in progress
- 7 applications currently being reviewed and finalized
 - 22 applications failed to receive grant funding due largely to not being able to meet eligibility requirements or applicants deciding not to move forward with projects
- Estimated annual stormwater capture for completed projects: 24.5 Million Gallons

SWMM Analysis



- •SWMM is not only a tool for regulatory compliance, but it is also used for planning and system optimization
- •SWMM results have shown that the County is complying with ACJ milestones and the GIF is a key component of the program's success



2012 & 2013 SWMM Update

- Incorporated weir survey elevation data
- Incorporated 2010-2013 green infrastructure projects
- Calibrated model using 2012 -13 flow monitoring data
- Minor Combined Sewer Catchment Boundary Adjustments Based
 On Field Data
- Added: Clinton Storage Facility (6.5 MG), Lower Harbor Brook Storage (4.9 MG), Metro New Screen and Grit flow control improvement project
- Trees were added as Green Infrastructure
- Coordinated 3rd party review and incorporated comments
- Identified priority GI project areas for 2013 focus







Save the Rain Green Improvement Fund 2014






GIF Program Boundary Map









2014 Program

- Tier funding remains in place
 - High Priority Areas (Green) = \$0.30/gallon
 - Medium Priority Areas (Yellow) = \$0.20/gallon
 - Low Priority Areas (red) = \$0.10/gallon
 - Potential Future Funding Area (blue) = currently not funded (gathering additional monitoring data)
- Updated GIF Program Description and Application
- Application Period: Thursday May 15, 2014 Friday December 5, 2014 (3PM deadline)



GIF Program Follow-up Items

Pending projects:

GIF projects under contract that are over two years old must present an implementation plan for construction to occur this season

Maintenance:

Routine maintenance inspections will be conducted on completed GIF projects

Reimbursement Procedure:

Payment claims are processed through the County Comptrollers office
