## FACT SHEET

### Walton Street – CSO 029 Sewer Improvements

Onondaga County will be improving sewer systems in the City of Syracuse with upgrades to the combined sewer system at the Walton Street Bridge. These improvements will reduce combined sewer overflow into nearby waters by increasing capacity of our combined sewer systems. The outcome of this project will be improved quality of life and water quality in Onondaga Creek and Onondaga Lake due to fewer combined sewer overflow events. Physical improvements from the work will include installation of a new regulator structure, raising and widening the weir within the regulator structure, replacing the adjacent manhole and piping, and installation of new ADA ramp and sidewalks.

**This project is being completed as part of the Onondaga County Save the Rain program, which is a county-wide initiative to improve the water quality of Onondaga Lake and its tributaries. #### What should businesses and patrons expect during construction?

Work will be completed along Walton Street just west of Franklin Street and south of Fayette Street (the area in red shown on the map below) and will require closure of a portion of Walton Street. A section of the Creekwalk between Fayette Street and Walton Streets will also be closed.

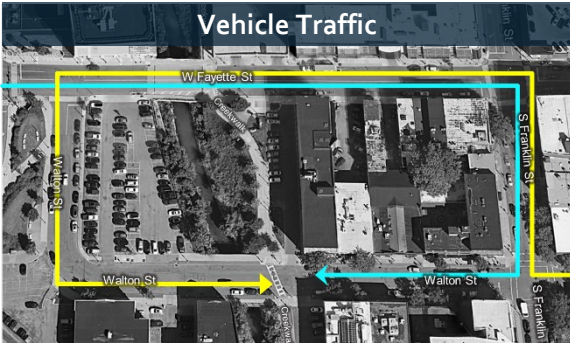


Construction is expected to begin in April 2022 and be completed in 4 to 5 months. During this time, businesses and visitors to the area can expect to see construction equipment and personnel during the hours of 7am – 4pm Monday through Friday. Weekend work is not anticipated, but business owners will be notified if that changes. ## Walton Street – CSO 029 Sewer Improvements

### How will navigation change during construction?



Vehicles will continue to have access to either end of Walton St. while through traffic will be entirely blocked for the middle third of Walton.



The Creekwalk between W Fayette and Walton Streets will be closed during construction and pedestrian traffic from the north will be diverted westward along W Fayette Street and south along Walton Street.



Pedestrian traffic near the Walton St. Bridge area will be diverted to the south side of the street to circumvent construction.



Access to the Walton St. parking lot will remain open from the west when approaching from W Fayette. There will be no access to the City Parking Lot and roughly 10 on-street parking spots will be blocked during construction. Local and private vehicle access to off-street parking near the Walton St. bridge will remain open.
